What's on this summer



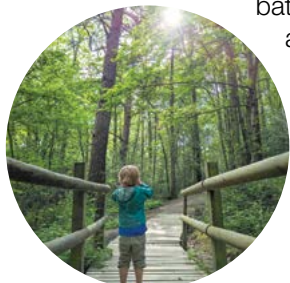
Get ready for a great line up of events over the summer.

Our Leisure Access Card



The Leisure Access Card is a free discount card that helps residents save money when visiting local attractions, going to the gym, swimming, or at The Capitol in Horsham.

It's completely free and you can apply in just a few minutes. To get a Leisure Access Card you need to live within the Horsham District boundaries and be in receipt of an income-based benefit, or be a full-time student aged 16 or over. Meet our Youth Forum

We are committed to supporting young people in Horsham District in a variety of ways, including offering opportunities for them to have their say, providing places for them to go and improving the availability of information and advice tailored to them.

One of the ways that we try and ensure young people can get their voices heard is via our Youth Forums.

The **Horsham District Youth Forum** meets monthly at Hurst Youth Centre. The group looks at campaigning, gives their views on elements of the Council's work and takes part in consultations.

Hot topics

In recent meetings they spoke about the reputation of young people in the District.

They talked about the actions of a small minority negatively affecting perceptions of them.



They considered the positives about living in the District; including the community feel, good schools and sporting opportunities on offer. They also talked about barriers to getting around and financial issues, including difficulties finding part-time employment.

They discussed pressures around mental health concerns, online issues such as harassment, cyber bullying as well as societal, educational and family expectations.

Expert advice

Following this, they were joined by representatives from Sussex Police who talked to them about the National Crime Agency's recent campaign focussing on the rise of 'sextortion' (a type of online blackmail where victims are targeted by offenders threatening to release explicit photos of them). A large proportion of cases have involved male victims aged between 14 and 18, and cases have contributed to self-harm and suicide making it an important topic for young people to recognise and feel comfortable reporting.

Views from across the District

In order to engage with more young people across the District, we have recently established a new **Storrington and Sullington Youth Forum**. We are also in the process of launching a Billingshurst and Pulborough group following a series of pre-meetings with students at The Weald school as well as at local youth groups.

Both new groups are facilitated by our Neighbourhood Wardens in partnership with the Parish Council. The Storrington and Sullington Youth Forum, which started in March 2024 meets at the football pavilion behind Chanctonbury Leisure Centre. You can read more about their first projects on page 12.

New play zone opens in Roffey



We are pleased to announce that our new youth activity area at Roffey Recreation Ground, off Leith View Road in Horsham opened in May.

Following a project in 2018 to transform the younger children's play area with a Medieval theme, we have now created an area primarily for teens and young people.

We are the first council in the country to install a 'Numuga', an innovative collection of equipment which offers users the chance to play football, rugby, cricket, basketball, netball, hockey and tennis in one compact area.

The new area also includes a 'chill zone' with hammocks, and an outdoor gym, which is perfect for anyone looking to exercise outside of a formal gym setting.

The inclusion of a variety of seating and new planting makes this a welcoming space for everyone. Later in the season, block colour will be added to the tarmac which will zone the playing areas and give an even brighter feel to the new space.

We are delighted to have seen so many people already enjoying the new equipment.

It helps users stay connected even if they are finding it hard to see, hear or use more complicated technology.

Helping patients home from hospital

The Ownfone is also used by healthcare providers as an effective way of discharging patients from hospital. They give the patient an immediate means to stay connected and access support as needed. Through the scheme, patients are provided with an Ownfone mobile in their discharge package. The device is provided for free for a fixed period to allow for further assistive technology to be installed. The units are then recycled back to the hospital for the next patient or transferred to the patient if they want to keep them.

This healthcare provider project is funded by the UK government through the UK Shared Prosperity Fund.

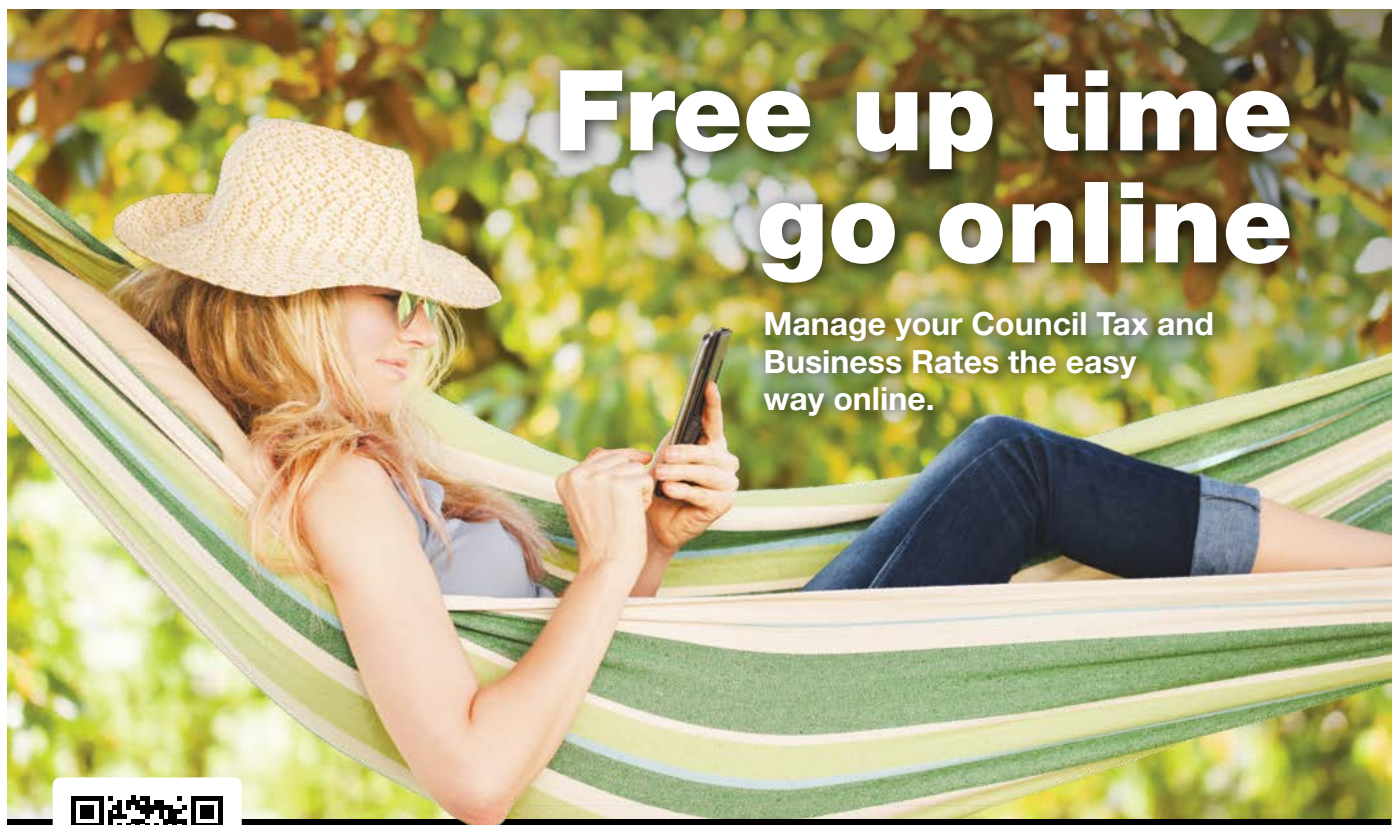

Discover Electric event

The Parkside building in Horsham played host to our first electric vehicle event on 24 May.

Aimed at individuals and commercial vehicle buyers, the event showcased all aspects of sustainable and cleaner travel. The event allowed visitors to browse, sit in and have test drives of popular models of electric cars, vans and commercial vehicles.

Presentations from industry professionals discussed the benefits of electric vehicles, the charging infrastructure and the practicalities for the individual driver as well as for businesses looking to electrify their fleet.

Expert advice was available from a variety of suppliers of electric vehicles and related electric vehicle charging infrastructure including charge point operators, installers and associated businesses.

The event was put on in partnership with charging infrastructure company Connected Kerb, event organisers Let's Experience Electric, the Energy Saving Trust and West Sussex County Council to help support carbon neutral goals. The event was funded by the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs' Air Quality Grant.

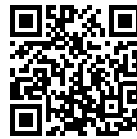
These try to let as many people as possible know about initiatives available within the District that help people deal with a wide range of challenges.

Check your eligibility for free home energy saving measures

Many more residents can now benefit from a Government Home Upgrade Grant thanks to changes to the eligibility criteria.

If your household income is up to £36,000 and you don't use a gas boiler as your main heating system, you can apply for free energy-saving upgrades for your home. These include insulation, air source heat pumps, solar panels and more.

Up to £38,000 in funding is available per household, depending on the property type and what measures are suitable for the property.

What if I have gas in my home?

You can still apply for this scheme if you have a gas connection provided it's not used for heating, for example if you have a gas cooker, but your home uses electric storage heaters.

Your home will be eligible for this scheme if it is mainly heated by any of the following methods:

- Electricity (storage heaters, electric boiler, panel heaters)
- Oil
- Coal
- Liquid Petroleum Gas (LPG)
- Solid fuel

The scheme will be open to applications until November 2024, with applications dealt with on a first come, first served basis.

Nurturing an eco-community

We are committed to taking action on climate change. To achieve our ambition, we are reliant on working with partnerships and the community.

In this edition we are celebrating climate action initiatives in Storrington and Sullington.

Local communities, businesses, schools, residents, and third sector organisations are all essential to delivering positive climate action.

In the District it is great to see the collective effect of community projects and initiatives which combined, make a real difference in an area.

Community action

Supported by the Council's Parish and Neighbourhood Climate Action Network, Storrington &

Sullington Parish Council have been championing a number of schemes and initiatives in the Parish, from reducing the energy use in buildings, nature recovery and bird boxes, to community recycling and food hubs. They are committed to leading on climate action themselves and spreading the word throughout the Parish.

The Storrington & Sullington Parish Council Clerk said:

“Active participation in the Council's Climate Action Group has proven invaluable, offering insights from other councils and serving as a source of inspiration. Recently, we have formed a Nature Recovery Working Party, signalling a commitment to environmental stewardship. We eagerly anticipate continued collaboration with the exceptional organisations within our District.”

Repair, don't replace

Another way you can do your bit is considering a visit to a repair café, where knowledgeable volunteers can help with repairing or reusing your broken items, which reduces what goes to landfill, as well as saving you money.

In Storrington, the Repair Café is open on the 3rd Saturday of each month, from 10am to 12pm at Storrington Primary School. For more info, email askstorringtonrepaircafe@outlook.com.

GET INVOLVED

Community Climate Fund

Three community groups in Storrington and Sullington have received funding from our Community Climate Fund for climate action projects.

The Community Climate Fund is a grant available to groups and organisations for projects which reduce their carbon emissions and create community value locally.

Storrington Community FC

The Football Club replaced their lighting with LED and sensor operated alternatives. This reduces energy use for the community facility which is enjoyed by some 250 regular users. The project team report:

“It has allowed the community to use the building with brighter and more efficient lighting.”

Storrington & Sullington Parish Council

Storrington & Sullington Parish Council replaced five heat pump air conditioner units with more efficient models (as pictured below) to reduce energy consumption on heating by 30%.

Their Clerk commented:

“The new heat pumps are working exceptionally well and we hope to see a marked difference in our energy bills going forward.”

1st Sullington and Storrington Scout Group

1st Sullington and Storrington Scout Group (pictured above) focussed on nature, enhancing their community garden at their base in part of the Trinity Methodist Church Grounds. The ongoing project looks to improve the biodiversity at the site. It also acts as a fantastic positive example both to passers-by and to the young people gaining their Beaver Scout Garden Activity Badges for looking after the site.

Senior Beaver Leader Gloria Gardner described the enthusiasm of the young people helping create the garden:

“The young Beavers are gaining gardening experience and learning more about the bugs and insects around them.”

The Community Climate Fund offers up to £5,000. Your organisation can apply once a year, provided it is for a new project in each application. The next round of funding opens on **1 July** and closes on **11 August**. The following round will open on **7 October** and close on **17 November 2024**.



The Wildways Project

The Wilder Horsham District initiative has been making great strides to create a Nature Recovery Network.

Creating this natural network involves connecting private land, gardens, schools, Parish Council owned land, and highway verges as well as our own sites to develop wildlife corridors which allow species to move freely from place to place.

One of the ways in which we have been collaborating this spring and summer, to add to these wildlife corridors, is through the Wildways Project.

A collaborative approach

Working with large landowners and community partners through Sussex Wildlife Trust, as well as with local groups such as Horsham Green Spaces Forum, BilliGreen, Wild about Warnham, and Greening Steyning, we have allowed the grass to grow in several selected council-owned sites to encourage more native wildflowers, attract bees, butterflies, moths and other pollinators as well as providing food for many birds.



This is in addition to our established meadow areas at our countryside sites including Southwater Country Park, Warnham Local Nature Reserve and Chesworth Farm.

A careful balance

Only selected areas at each of the sites are being managed in this way. We have continued to mow pathways and retain short amenity grass for other uses, be that walking, sport, play, picnicking or simply having somewhere to relax.

The grass in the Wildways areas will be cut later in the summer. This approach enables the wildflowers to out-compete the grass in time as it continues to grow and set seed. As the wildflowers become well established, they will look more abundant.

Homelessness support in our District

process at each step and be clear about what they might expect and the resources we have available.”

Our Housing Officers work incredibly hard with those facing homelessness to resolve the issues they are experiencing and to assist them in finding a solution.

The job varies immensely day-to-day, depending on who makes contact for support and what help they need; everybody has a unique set of circumstances.

People are often curious about what happens when a person facing homelessness contacts us. We spoke to one of our Homelessness Officers to find out more.

The initial call for help

“Someone might make contact through self-referral, or a referral may come from another professional.

“We will discuss whether they qualify for help to secure accommodation, and if their circumstances meet the criteria as a ‘priority need’. This is a category defined in The Housing Act for those considered vulnerable - for instance, if they are the primary carer for a child.

“We will create a tailored plan together and agree a range of steps to help. This may include supporting negotiations with a current landlord, looking at private rental options, specialist housing options for over 55s, and supported housing. We will also seek to maximise household income by ensuring the individual is accessing benefits and other support they are eligible for.

Housing demand outstripping supply

“We aim to help irrespective of whether the household is in priority need, although we would only be able to offer interim accommodation if they are. We are guided by the law and the Homelessness Code of Guidance for local authorities. While we always want to help, we do not own any housing stock and the demand for social housing in the District far exceeds supply, so we work with housing associations and registered social landlords.”

How we partner with other agencies

“We have fantastic partnerships with other agencies who can help support a person at risk of homelessness - including Citizens Advice, Turning Tides, and Horsham Matters. We also link in with partners at the Salvation Army, local church groups, drug and alcohol services and other organisations.”

How it feels to work in the Housing team

“Having an experienced team and a whole network of supportive agencies to refer to means we can often suggest options that someone hasn’t even considered which can make a big difference.

I’d encourage anyone facing homelessness to get in contact as soon as possible. People can feel intimidated about asking for support and might have misconceptions about us having available housing stock, or how our Housing Register works so we try to explain the

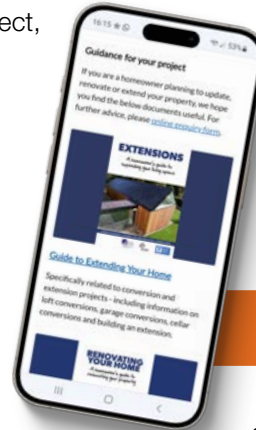

Discover Environmental Health and Licensing

The work of our Environmental Health and Licensing team touches all aspects of daily life.

We are often behind the scenes, keeping you safe at home, in town, at work and during your leisure time. Here are just some of the areas we look after:

Housing health and safety

We carry out risk assessments to ensure homes are safe, in good repair and have adequate amenities.

Noise nuisance

We carry out investigations to assess whether noise is causing a nuisance.

Bonfires

Garden bonfires can be anti-social, polluting and damaging to health.

Taxi and private hire licences

We make sure the vehicles getting you from A to B are insured, safe and that drivers are checked.

Air quality

We monitor air quality across the District.



Health and safety at work

We offer advisory audits to help businesses meet workplace health and safety requirements.

Eating out

We carry out inspections of local food businesses as part of the Food Hygiene Rating Scheme and offer food safety training.

Tattooing, piercing and electrolysis licences

All businesses undertaking treatments which pierce the skin must be licenced to ensure that all procedures, equipment, and facilities are safe.

Premises and alcohol licences

Many of our high street shops, bars and restaurants sell and serve alcohol, our role as licensing authority is to ensure alcohol is sold safely.

Gambling, gaming and lotteries

We issue gambling premises licences for places such as betting shops and bingo clubs as well as licences for small society lotteries.

Events, busking, and street trading

We look after licences for temporary events, entertainers, charity collections and street trading.

Stray dogs

We run a lost and found dog service which handles the recovery and kennelling of stray dogs found within the District.

Animal welfare licences

We look after lots of licences to make sure animals are properly cared for. These include licences for:

- Pet shops
- Animal boarding
- Dog breeding
- Zoos
- Animal training and exhibitions
- Horses and stables



Caravan and campsites

For visitors and holidaymakers, we look after licences for caravan and campsites, as well as sites for residential use.

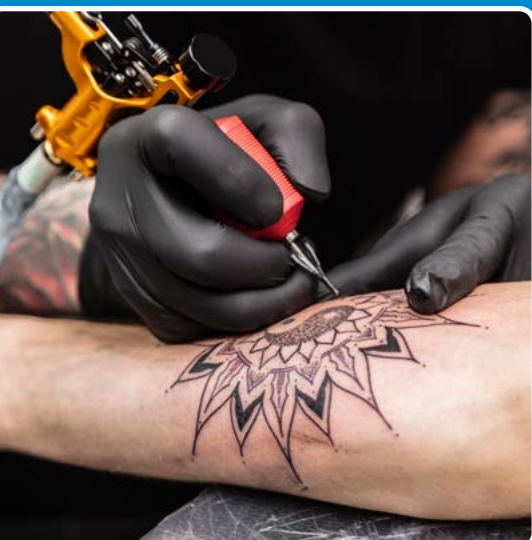

How we can help you quit

Horsham Wellbeing has a team of six trained 'Stop Smoking Advisors' ready to support you. Our Advisors are trained to help you navigate your cravings and stop smoking in the most effective way. You will have weekly contact with an allocated advisor who will check in with you and provide the correct Nicotine Replacement Therapy. You will also get to monitor your carbon monoxide reading which will continue to go down the longer you are smoke free; the lower the reading the more oxygen your body is able to carry to your lungs meaning breathing is much easier and pressure on your heart decreases.

Our small friendly team are always available to give you more information on the stop smoking service so that you feel prepared for when you decide you want to quit.

Keeping our streets clean

Did you know our fantastic crew are out keeping our streets spotless 365 days a year?

While most of us are still tucked up in bed or just starting the day, our team are out working hard across the District making sure it's looking it's best every morning.

We know cleanliness makes a huge difference. A clean and safe environment ensures residents, businesses and visitors all enjoy the area. We are really proud of our clean streets.

We joined some of our hard-working crew

We caught up with the team in Horsham, who begin their day at 5am. They ensure the town centre area is tidied, clean and clear of litter and debris each morning. They work every day, including weekends and holidays, whatever the conditions.

Town centre crews use our fantastic electric sweepers which help them complete their tasks with minimal noise and environmental impact. The compact electric sweepers and our push along 'green machine' get up close to all the difficult-to-reach areas. The crew also use brooms and a jet washer to clear pavements, stonework, benches, leaves, and litter anywhere the machines cannot access.

We also have larger vehicles covering the whole District. These can tackle some of the more stubborn dirt and maintenance jobs, as well as circulating all our town centres weekly. The crew also respond to reported issues and make sure every residential street right across the District is covered at least twice a year, that's over 1,600 miles of streets!

Meet our great team

Rob, who was on duty in Horsham said:

"The job is not always easy, but I do get a lot of satisfaction when I come into town, seeing people enjoying being here and seeing how smart it looks.

"We have a great team. Often the public never see the mess left behind after a busy evening. We make sure it's always safe and clean for everyone to enjoy, usually before anyone has even left home."

High powered gum-busting

Chewing gum is one of the more challenging pieces of litter which gets dropped, sticks to and stains pavements. The team has recently been tackling East Street in Horsham with a high-powered jet washer, working in sections. If you look down the next time you are walking, you'll notice the difference!

Adopt your street

If you want to help keep your road extra clean, look out for our Adopt a Street scheme. This already sees hundreds of volunteers across the District give up their time to keep their road tidy. Volunteers choose the area they want to adopt, and we provide all the equipment they need, as well as collecting any litter that they pick up.

Don't bin them; recycle your electricals

Residents are being reminded how to recycle batteries, small electricals and vapes.

These items pose a fire risk if placed in refuse or recycling bins due to the compaction equipment on our collection lorries.

The compaction can cause them to ignite and set fire to other collected materials, potentially causing thousands of pounds worth of damage to equipment.

How to dispose of these items safely:

- **Batteries** – please place on top of your refuse or recycling bin in a clear bag. Our crews place these into cages on the outside of the collection vehicles to be recycled.
- **Small electricals and vapes** – households can book a free collection for these items. Please bag disposable vapes together for collection. For reusable vapes, please remove the battery and recycle this separately.

Disposable barbecues

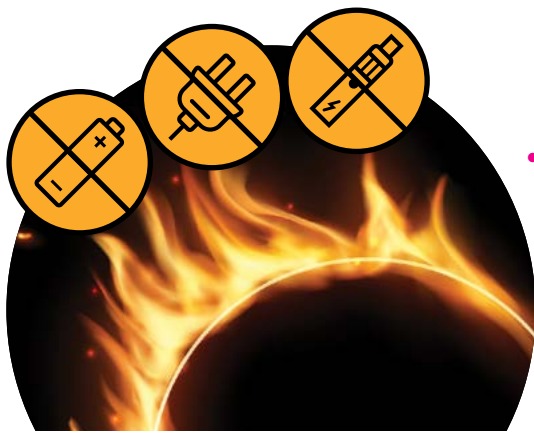
Disposable barbecue waste can also present a fire risk in bins and collection lorries. If you are disposing of barbecue waste, please let everything cool down thoroughly. Smouldering coals and hot ash can set fire to items in your bin.

We have had fires in our collection lorries from battery and barbecue waste, so please dispose of these items carefully to keep our crews and equipment safe and your collections running on time.

You should make your claim for Universal Credit before the deadline date on your letter. If your letter does not have a deadline date, you don't need to claim yet unless you want to.
